Call for Nominations - Management Division Award

The Management Division of AIChE normally presents the Management Division Award at the AIChE National Spring Meeting each year.

The Management Division Award recognizes an outstanding individual who has made a substantial contribution to the management of engineers involved in the chemical process industries or to management techniques and procedures utilized in those industries. It is not required that the nominee be a member of the Management Division or that their academic training was in Chemical Engineering.

Nominations must be submitted by January 15, 2010 via e-mail to tmildnhl@kcc.com. The 2010 award will be given, as normally done, at the Spring National Meeting in San Antonio.

The most important part of the nomination information is a description of the contribution the nominee has made to

the management of engineers. The nomination should also include contact information for the nominee; a short biographical sketch of the nominee including education, work experience, professional and civic organization participation/leadership and any other relevant information.

The award consists of a plaque and \$1000 honorarium. The recipient is our guest at the Management Division Dinner and where possible is invited to give a presentation.
